- The meeting was opened with prayer and began with lunch and fellowship.
- Received reports from Treasurer Dana Friedman, Acting Clerk Kathryn Henry, and Moderator Kathryn Escandell.
- Discussed the need for childcare during worship. While the Nursery is undergoing renovation, the children's area of Fellowship Hall will be expanded to include sufficient space, seating, and supplies. The Session will work to meet Best Practices guidelines of having two adults present by hiring a staff person who is consistently present and asking congregational volunteers to sign up for particular weeks.

READINGS FOR DECEMBER 21 – ADVENT 4: When you’re afraid, give me your hand.

• Isaiah 41:5-10

⁵The coastlands have seen and are afraid;
the ends of the earth tremble;
they have drawn near and come.
⁶Each one helps the other,
saying to one another, “Take courage!”
⁷The artisan encourages the goldsmith,
and the one who smooths with the hammer encourages the one who strikes the anvil,
saying of the soldering, “It is good,”
and they fasten it with nails so that it cannot be moved.
⁸But you, Israel, my servant,
Jacob, whom I have chosen,
the offspring of Abraham, my friend;
⁹you whom I took from the ends of the earth
and called from its farthest corners,
saying to you, “You are my servant;
I have chosen you and not cast you off”;
¹⁰do not fear, for I am with you;
do not be afraid, for I am your God;
I will strengthen you; I will help you;
I will uphold you with my victorious right hand.

• Gospel:

Matthew 1:18-25

¹⁸Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. ²⁰But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, “Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” ²²All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

²³“Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son,
and they shall name him Emmanuel,”

which means, “God is with us.” ²⁴When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife ²⁵but had no marital relations with her until she had given birth to a son, ^b and he named him Jesus.
