

When you bear this fruit, you represent who I am – my name. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask for. 17 I am telling you this so you will walk the road of love with each other."

New life in Christ takes shape in a community in which people know that God loves and accepts them not because of what they have done, but because of who they are in their deepest selves – beloved children of God.


They therefore can accept themselves and love others, knowing that no one has any ground on which to stand, except God's grace. (9.22)
