

Luke 10:1-11 (NRSV)

After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go.² He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³ Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. ⁴ Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. ⁵ Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!'" ⁶ And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house.⁸ Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; ⁹ cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' ¹⁰ But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, to out into its streets and say, ¹¹'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Invitation to the Table On this morning, as we celebrate the blessings God has granted this congregation and seek to discern the future God wills for us, it is fitt

congregation and seek to discern the future God wills for us, it is fitting that we gather at our Lords' table where we, as Christ's church, are nourished in spirit and in body.

Because this church – First Presbyterian of McAllen – is a part of the long, rich, diverse story of Christ's church, it is fitting that our Prayer of Great Thanksgiving is an ancient eucharistic prayer attributed to Hippolytus of Rome and dated to the early third century. The blessings we have known and the future we dream are not ours alone, for with Christians from every age and all places, we are one in the Spirit, we are one in the Lord. The unity we find in Christ Jesus is expressed in the communion we share at this table, to which our Lord invites us all.

Prayer of Great Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you / And also with you. Lift up your hearts. / We lift them to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. / It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks, O God,

through your beloved Servant, Jesus Christ,

whom you have sent in these last times

as Savior and redeemer, and messenger of your will.

He is your Word, inseparable from you, through whom you made all things and in whom you take delight. You sent him from heaven into the Virgin's womb, where he was conceived, and took flesh. Born of the Virgin by the power of the Holy Spirit, he was revealed as your Son.

In fulfillment of your will he stretched out his hands in suffering to release from suffering those who place their trust in you, and so won for you a holy people. He freely accepted the death to which he was handed over, in order to destroy death and to shatter the chains of the evil one; to trample underfoot the powers of hell and to lead the righteous into light; to fix the boundaries of death and to manifest resurrection.

And so he took bread, gave thanks to you, and said: "Take, and eat; this is my body, broken for you." In the same way, he took the cup, saying: "This is my blood, shed for you. When you do this, do it for remembrance of me."

Remembering, therefore, his death and resurrection, we set before you this bread and cup, thankful that you have counted us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you as your priestly people We ask you to send your Holy Spirit upon the offering of the holy church. Gather into one all who share these holy mysteries, filling them with the Holy Spirit and confirming their faith in the truth, that together we may praise you and give you glory, through your Servant, Jesus Christ. Through him, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God, with the Holy Spirit in the holy church, now and forever. Amen.
